I'm certain none of it would have been possible without the time you all gave me to really consider where I've come from and where I'm going. Other folks played important parts – especially clergy friends encouraging me - but to my mind, it all comes back to the amazing experience of sabbatical. May God bless you as you have been a blessing to me, and so many in our communities, and so many others we may never know! Let us go forth in the name of Christ!

CHURCH SCHOOL~ has begun. Even though our numbers are small, it is important that our children receive Christian education. This year we are trying a new method of teaching, Christian video on the new TV system. We do need additional teachers. - Socks for Boys (Kids shoe size 10 to Adult 8)

VESTRY HI-LITES NOVEMBER VESTRY MEETING

1. It was suggested, by a parishioner, that we consider establishing a program for the exchange of hats, gloves, scarfs, etc. in the community. Carol Cimini is looking into the prospects of our putting a box at the library for this purpose. The vestry will support the plan financially.
2. Outreach contributions were approved to the “Voices” drug rehab program in Broome County and to the Berkeley Divinity School at Yale. This latter contribution is from funds that were approved to help with the playground at Afton School but which is no longer looking for donations for that project. The Christmas offering will be sent to the General Theological Seminary, supplemented with the December outreach funds of \$200.
3. **New Business:** This year our Christmas outreach will be to provide underwear and socks for the school nurse at Afton School to distribute to children in need. All parishioners are asked to bring children’s socks and underwear, both boys and girls, and put them in the box at the back of the church.
4. We are planning to have a Christmas tableau/manger scene at the Christmas Eve service.
5. It was approved to purchase two new card tables.

The Learning Community Initiative team at St Ann's is planning to place a sock and hat table for giveaway near the Food Pantry donation basket at the Church. Each item will be individually placed in a ziplock bag. We are encouraging anyone and everyone who knows of a needy person or for themselves to take an item or 2. Please be sure to let us know if the numbers are getting low so we will restock. Also please take just what you need and leave some for others.

We plan on setting up another venue elsewhere in Afton but have to confirm where and when at a later date. Thank you for your support of this necessary mission! IT IS COLD OUTSIDE! BRRRRR

This seems to be excellent advice for us as we embark on the season of Advent with its air of anticipation, expectation and contemplation. With all the hype to decorate, buy countless gifts, attend loud, boisterous parties and prepare extravagant meals, how many of us can say that we are at peace and, if we are not, how might we experience that peace?

I would suggest that it involves setting priorities, or, in the words of our Presiding Bishop (PB,) "making some conscious decisions about how to spend your Advent time this year." Granted, there's lots to be done in the brief four weeks until Christmas but how much of it is essential?

If it's important to us we can all find 10 minutes a day in all of our busy-ness, pick a quiet place and spend part of it talking to God and the rest of it listening for His answers. Again, our PB suggests giving thanks for our various blessings. Or you might read the Scripture selections for the coming Sunday and let them speak to you. If you absolutely cannot find time to do this, try praying, praising and thanking God as you are falling asleep each night. I've found it's a great way to end the day and might even help you fall asleep! What better way to get away from the pressure of the secular world? Why not give it a try?

Our society emphasizes caring for our physical and mental health and this is good to a point. But what about our spiritual health? Peter tells us to grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. How are we doing with that? In computer programming a common acronym is: GIGO which stands for "Garbage In= Garbage Out." Our spirit is much the same as a computer. What we get out of it depends on what we put in. How are you caring for your spirit? Now is a perfect time to do something for it! Peace be with you. PCV


