Welcome June!

In one of my sermons in May, I read a passage (pp. 15-119) from The Meaning of Jesus: Two Visions. A wonderful book co-authored by Marcus J. Borg and N.T. Wright.

I think, like most people, from time to time I get to wondering "Why am I doing the things I do?". Now, I don't mean the eye-rolling, throwing my hands up sort of questioning (Why am I doing the things I do?" (though, honestly, from time to time that happens, too).

What I mean is the sort of wondering that comes when you feel like you're working hard at a thing and you are somewhat certain that you're making some sort of progress, but it's not at all clear exactly what progress you may (or may not) be making.

Another way to put it – or a closely related question - is "What are we as Christians doing with our regular worship and study of our faith?" The fancy word the church has for what we do is "liturgy" and it means "the work of the people". This is also part of what's known as "spiritual discipline" and "Rule of life".

Now, as this question was floating around in my head, I was also participating in a clergy group that meets regularly a couple times a month to pray Morning Prayer and study The Rule of Benedict: A Spirituality for the 21st Century by Joan Chittister.

Lo! And Behold! In one of our meetings, we read in Chittister's commentary on the passage of the day from St Benedict's Rule a short story that speaks directly to the question I had rolling around in my head. Chittister writes:

"The ancients say that once upon a time a disciple asked the elder, 'Holy One, is there anything I can do to make myself enlightened?' And the Holy One answered, 'As little as you can do to make the sun rise in the morning.' Then of what use, 'the surprised disciple asked, 'are the spiritual exercises you prescribe?' 'To make sure,' the

elder said, 'you are not asleep when the sun begins to rise.'"

Now, to me, and hopefully to you too, that really seems to make a lot of good

sense. Blessing upon blessing to you all!

- 1. Voted to support the Afton Driving Park as a community project in the amount of \$300. Also voted to send \$200 to the Rescue Mission. This brings us up to date on our \$200 per month outreach donations.
- 2. Thanked Woodie for his work with Economy fuel in negotiating our fuel oil price.
- 3. Thanked the men for putting on the Mother's Day breakfast.
- 4. Noted that we need to proceed with the repair of the cracked counter in the kitchen. Also would like to have the kitchen painted after the counter is repaired.
- 5. Delegates were designated for the Diocesan Convention, Amy and Denise Wieber as delegates, Betty Vail and Tracey Tallmadge as alternates.
- 6. Approved use by Sertoma of electricity and rest rooms on Afton Sidewalk/arts & crafts days. We plan to have a booth similar to last year at the Sidewalk Days.
- 7. Woodie to get an estimate to power wash the church building.
- 8. Carol Cimini to talk with school bus drivers about providing them with winter clothing for children in need.
- 9. Estimate reviewed for paving of the church parking lot. Additional estimates are being obtained.
- 10. Zion and St. Paul's churches have been invited to St. Ann's picnic which will be held at Kellystone Park on June 9th.
- 11. Fr. David noted that the possible mission trip has fallen through.
- 12. Discussion on what St. Ann's could do to help the community and/or individual needs. Fr. David to contact the Office of the Aging for Chenango County for possible suggestions. Robin & Lauren Felldin to work on a handout for identifying people in need that we might be able to assist.
- 13. Treasurer's report was presented. We are solvent, thanks be to God and the generosity of parishioners.
- 14. The new Quicken software has been installed on Pete's and Tracey's computers. Thanks to Gary Zurn for his help with this new software installation.

In the Epistle reading for Pentecost 4, Paul refutes the teaching that certain requirements must be met before a person can be saved.

It seems to me that if Paul were writing to us in our time, he might have said, there is no longer Methodist or Presbyterian, there is no longer Baptist or Roman Catholic, there is no longer Congregational or Episcopalian, and maybe even, there is no longer St. Ann's or St. Peter's or Zion! However I'm sure he would still make his point that "all of you are one in Christ Jesus!"

Are we one in Christ Jesus? As we encounter challenges and difficulties in our church are we focused on discerning what God is calling us to do and how we might be more effective in spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ? Or are we concentrating on how to keep St. Ann's as we would like to see it? These are tough questions, to be sure, maybe even uncomfortable ones, but they must be addressed.

St. Ann's has always been blessed with a strong and talented laity that has weathered many a storm over the years. And it is no different now. Several among us have indicated a willingness to lead services. A few years ago, a goodly number of parishioners attended Fr. Ralph's training for Lay Eucharistic Visitors. 
