

From Fr. Dave

I hope this message finds you all doing well. It was brought to my attention that at least some of you (most of you?) have little idea of what I do aside from Sunday services and weddings and funerals. After one of our wardens noticed that part of my Letter of Agreement includes a comment that about 10% of my time is expected to be spent on diocesan sorts of things, we had a little talk about some of the things I do. He suggested I let you all know as well.

So here's a bit of what I do as a priest in the Diocese of Central New York: as part of my community involvement, I am a parent/community representative on the Chenango Co ARC's Incident Review Board. I perform HE at the New York State Vet's Home in Oxford a couple times every month. I'm also on the Blessings in a Backpack board for Greene Central Schools. And, a much less formal community activity, I enjoy the Mens Coffee Group in Oxford a couple times every month. As needed and when it's possible, I help out at Oxford, Greene and Afton's food pantries (for Greene's food pantry, part of my duties as co-president of Greene Area Churches). When I can, I help out at Oxford's soup kitchen.

Other activities are: I'm the convener of the Utica area Discernment Team which is one of the first steps for anyone seeking ordination to the diaconate or priesthood (I have to note, this has been extraordinarily rewarding!). As indicated above, I'm co-president (along with Pastor Amy Gregory) of Greene Area Churches. I'm also a parish representative for Afton Interchurch Council. I also have occasional meetings with Fr Chuck Taylor as part of the Chenango District and about twice monthly I participate in a clergy prayer group called Canterbury Way.

I guess that's about it. I'm not entirely sure how much of it counts towards the diocesan 10%, but it is incredibly rewarding for me to be a part of so many cooperative adventures! Most importantly, however, whatever good work I may be doing, it really wouldn't be possible without all of you supporting your parishes. It's not always easy to be a part of three cooperating parishes. But, between the blessings of you all and the blessings of God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I am most honored to be an Episcopal priest and serve you and our communities as best I can.

May the Lord have mercy on us all, and may the Lord continue to bless all of us!

Then these righteous ones will reply, 'Lord, when did we ever see you hungry and feed you? Or thirsty and give you something to drink? Or a stranger and show you hospitality? Or naked and give you clothing? When did we ever see you sick or in prison, and visit you?' And the King will tell them, 'I assure you, when you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to me!'

Matthew 25: 37-40

Many are familiar with this portion of the Gospel reading appointed for the last Sunday in Pentecost. Jesus is describing what it will be like when the Son of Man returns. Clearly, he is saying that we will be held accountable for the way we have dealt throughout our lives with those who are less fortunate than we are.

It's interesting and probably not a coincidence that this reading comes during the time when we are anticipating Thanksgiving Day, and thinking about what we will give back to God in thanksgiving for what He has given us. It is easy and tempting to think of this simply in terms of money. But if we do that, we have already missed the mark. For not only are we required to be good stewards of our treasure, but also of the time and the talents that God has given each of us. And this gets into how we live our lives.

Are we living examples of what it means to be a Christian? In our own town of Afton, people lack adequate food and drink. Are we supporting the Afton Food Pantry and St. Ann's Closet? Do we give of our time to help staff them? Do we warmly welcome strangers and newcomers who join us at St. Ann's? As a member of St. Ann's, are we doing our part to accomplish our mission: Sharing God's love in our community through prayer, study and action? Do we reach out in love to those less fortunate than ourselves? These are some of the things I'll think about this month as I consider how to respond to God in thanksgiving.
