

From Fr. Dave

Greetings! I've got to tell you all a little story: Way back when I was a chaplain at Strong Memorial Hospital in Rochester, I had opportunities to minister to many different folks in many different situations. Among the most incredible moments were the ones spent with folks in hospice/palliative care. Years before I was at Strong, I sat with my mom during her last hours. They've all been very powerful experiences, as I'm sure you can imagine.

But, one day I walked into the gift shop at Strong and I saw a t-shirt that instantly captured my attention. It was a shirt which listed all the things that cancer cannot do. It reads:

"WHAT CANCER CANNOT DO - Cancer is so limited...it cannot cripple love; it cannot shatter hope; it cannot kill friendship; it cannot destroy confidence; it cannot shut out memories; it cannot eat away peace; it cannot silence courage; it cannot corrode faith; it cannot reduce eternal life; it cannot quench the Spirit."

I've had this t-shirt for about 6 years now and though I've had friends and family who've battled cancer, it never seemed quite right to give the shirt to any of them.

Then, one day recently, a parishioner was nearing the end of her physical life among us; cancer had beaten her body down. I wanted to ask her if the shirt was true, but I never got the chance. But, at the same time, I also came to realize how badly I want the shirt to be true. Now, I'm wise enough to know that as much as I may want something, having it is a much different reality. Still, as much as I hope it's true, I so desperately want it to be true.

But, as I prepared for the parishioner's memorial service and as I considered how very badly I want that shirt's slogans to be true, I came to realize that it's up to each and every one of us to make sure those slogans are true. It's up to us to make sure cancer - and death - is so weak. Whatever we may face in our life, we don't have to face it alone. That doesn't mean that there's one right way to show caring and love for a person who's passing (and, in all reality, which one of us isn't at some point in passing?). It's a matter of knowing each other and caring for each other and finding ways to let each other know that we do, in fact, care. Amen.

Even though we are a small Parish, it is important to support your parish by your attendance. The elections and reports are the only business to come before this meeting and it is typically short. Please do your best to attend.

United Thank Offering (UTO)

The UTO Fall Ingathering will take place November 2nd. The information below includes thoughts taken from a letter by the Diocesan UTO Chairperson.

"As usual I must press upon you to inform your parish that the UTO is NOT a fund raiser. We exist mainly (as a mechanism to help people develop) a healthy prayer life. A day consists of 24 hours. That is 1,440 minutes. Can you afford to use one of them for a prayer? Try it!"

That having been said, the United Thank Offering is a great reminder for us to offer prayers of thanksgiving for God's daily blessings in our lives. Even a few coins offered in thanksgiving each day can add up to a significant amount over 6 months. And when these individual offerings are gathered together, great things can be done.

St. Ann's Treasurer's Report To 2014 Annual Meeting

St. Ann's ended 2013 with an overall positive cash flow of about \$9,108 based on all income versus 2013 expenses and outreach. Our 2013 outreach apart from diocesan payments totaled \$3,056.60, about \$656 over what was planned. Pledge income and loose plate offerings exceeded expectations and investment income was also over expectations. We received Chenango District Mission Grant money totaling \$4,417.63. Given our improving cash flow, your vestry decided to return to donating the recommended pledge to the diocese. We appreciate the generosity of all who give to support St. Ann's as we strive to discern and carry out what God would have us do in our community and the world.

We had no capital improvements in 2013 which in our case indicates that your leaders are exercising good stewardship over St. Ann's physical plant.

To date in 2014, our outreach amounts to \$2,152.63 Your Vestry considers monthly where best to spend our outreach dollars. This is the first item on the agenda for each Vestry meeting to remind us of its importance. If you have any suggestions, please let one of your wardens or vestry-people know. Once again, we have been blessed with a reasonably good financial condition. It seems only fitting that we should share our blessings with others less fortunate. To date in 2014, our income exceeds our expenditures by approximately \$1385. This will likely shrink once Zion gets a treasurer on board and we get up to date with Fr. Dave's support.

God continues to provide us with blessings. We are blessed to have Fr. David Hanselman serving us on a shared basis with Zion, Greene and St. Paul's, Oxford. Since Fr. Dave cannot serve in four places at the same time, St. Ann's has lay-led Morning Prayer services approximately every other Sunday. It has been gratifying to see an increasing number of St. Ann's parishioners step up to the challenge of leading Morning Prayer. As a result our expenditure for clergy support has been reduced. Not having an organist has also reduced our outlay and we appreciate that the congregation tolerates Synthia'sâ occasional foibles.

St. Ann's continues to face increases in costs just as we do in our personal lives. As I've pointed out in previous years' reports, most of our expenses are "non-discretionary." That is, we cannot reduce them, at least not significantly. These are things like insurance, diocesan and personnel expenses, electricity, heat, water and telephone. We're all aware of the continuing significant rise in the cost of energy. We continue to look for opportunities to reduce our energy consumption, the most effective being to simply


lower the thermostat. We appreciate everyone's cooperating by adding layers of clothing. At year's end, most budget line items should be near or possibly under the amounts budgeted and I'm hopeful that we'll end the year on a positive note. Detailed financial data can always be found on the parish hall bulletin board.

The proposed budget for 2015 expenses is approximately the same as that for 2014. Supply clergy expenses should be nearly non-existent as many of our parishioners are stepping up to the task of leading Morning Prayer services. It's also assumed that we'll continue without an organist. It is possible that our portion of Fr. David's support may increase by a small percentage. Hopefully pledge and loose plate income will continue at current levels. The budget also reflects a more realistic (I hope) projection of investment income that has improved since the diocese converted to a new investment firm. We also received notice that St. Ann's will be receiving a generous bequest from the estate of Fay Todd. The details are not yet known. Fuel oil expense is increased by \$500 and we have returned to giving the full suggested pledge amount to the diocese. Given continued support from our parish family, we should be able to meet our expenses. We will need to continue to remain vigilant in our spending and generous in our support. St. Ann's survival depends upon each of us being doers of The Word and not hearers only! I have faith that, if we seek to do what God would have us do in our community, He will provide St. Ann's the means to do it.

The Final Word



Always be full of joy in the Lord. I say it again--rejoice! Let everyone see that you are considerate in all you do. Remember, the Lord is coming soon. Don't worry about anything, instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. If you do this, you will experience God's peace, which is far more wonderful than the human mind can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4;4-7.

The above verses from the Epistle reading for Oct 12th seem particularly appropriate for this time of the year. People and organizations are preparing next year's budgets, worrying as they do whether they will have enough coming in to cover what is needed for 2015. The word "stewardship" pops up in sermons and newsletter articles along with "UTO," "pledge," "commitment," etc. The people who are responsible for financial planning, whether it be personal, corporate or church can find it easy to worry. Will there be enough money to cover insurance, utilities, personnel expenses, medical costs, etc. All these things are necessary but they don't bring real peace of mind and heart. We still lie awake at night wondering what would happen if the market collapses or if that spot on the X-ray turns out to be cancer. According to Paul in this passage, the primary result of prayer is not necessarily healing or miraculous provision, but peace. When you feel anxiety, fear or insecurity, remember Paul's encouragement to "pray about everything." Interestingly, last month's article on the UTO pointed out that UTO's primary mission is to improve people's prayer life. And while we pray, let us trust God to guard our heart and mind with a supernatural and inexplicable peace.
