From Fr. Dave

I pray the Lord finds you well.

As I'm writing this (in late March), I can't help but look out the window and wonder if Spring will ever arrive. The calendar says it did, but the snow flurries beg otherwise.

At this point, it's hard to imagine the earth will put forth its blossoms again. But, it has to. Spring is unavoidable. Whatever sort of Spring it might be, it is certain to come sooner or later.

Until that happens, we're still in the grip of winter. I have to beg your pardon, but it seems an occupational hazard of mine is that I often cannot help but draw parallels between the things that are going on in the life all around me and the faith that we all share. That is, the faith that we all practice together, from time to time helps me understand my experience of life.

And so it is, that I cannot help but compare winter with "the world". Mostly because there's been more than a few moments recently in which winter really has started to wear me out. And there's been plenty of times in which the world has worn me out, too.

Sometimes the coldness of wind and human apathy blows so hard it chills you to the bone. When that happens, it seems to me that the best thing to do is to get moving and find some shelter.

During our worship services this April, we will be reading about that glorious "in-between" time when the Risen Christ walked and talked and ate with his friends. So many of the stories begin with the group being frightened or confused, and then Jesus appears among them and they know they have shelter.

And then an amazing thing happened as they gained more and more experience of the Risen Christ, as they came to know more and more that Jesus was indeed always with them - their fear and confusion was replaced by confidence and direction. It may not come as quickly as we'd like, but we can be certain that God will eventually replace our fear and confusion with confidence and direction. As surely as Spring will come and become Summer, Jesus will be with us - today and always. Amen.

Afton Food Pantry

During the months of March and April, all monies donated to the Afton Food Pantry will be used to determine matching funds to be donated by the Alan Feinstein Foundation. This is an annual challenge through which this foundation helps to alleviate the hunger problem in the United States. For the 16th consecutive year, Alan Shawn Feinstein will divide \$1 million among hunger fighting agencies nationwide, using it to help them raise funds during March and April 2013.

Donations to the Afton Food Pantry will be tallied and submitted to the Feinstein Foundation so that our local food pantry can receive a proportionate amount of the \$1 million dollars.

This year it is setting aside \$1 Million to be distributed proportionately among all participating food pantries. Please do what you can so that the Afton Food Pantry can again receive a part of this generous donation of matching funds. Donations can be:

-Canned and boxed food items may be brought to the Food Pantry, located at the Afton United Methodist Church, 36 Spring St., Afton, NY, during the months of March and April and will count toward the challenge, with a value of \$1 per item. Only currently dated, staple food items in undamaged original containers can be accepted.

The Afton Food Pantry is open on Mondays from 5 pm—7 pm, and on Wednesdays from 9 am to 11 am. The Food Pantry continues to serve a substantial number of families, the elderly and individuals in the Afton community. Local support is appreciated. The Pantry is staffed by volunteers, and all funds and food received are used exclusively by the Food Pantry to help local people in need.
